



Summer fieldwork is now underway across the Crown Mountain Project. While the project remains in the development phase, we are completing maintenance, environmental monitoring, and infrastructure improvements that protect the site today and prepare it for future milestones.

Summer Work Underway



Road Maintenance

- Ditch and road maintenance is underway to support road stability and prevent erosion.
- Water bars have been temporarily filled in for the summer to allow smoother travel on site roads, and will be re-established this fall to manage runoff over the winter.
- Deactivated sections of road are clearly marked on site — keep an eye out for warning signage like this if you're travelling through the Project area.

Weather Station

- A new weather station is being installed to collect meteorological data at the same location used for a previous station in 2013–14.
- In addition to standard weather data, the new station will measure snowfall and snow depth.



Environmental Data Collection

Our environmental team has a busy season of field surveys and ongoing monitoring planned across the Project area:

- Woodpecker surveys
- Bat surveys
- Gillette's Checkerspot butterfly habitat survey
- Ongoing water quality, water quantity, and groundwater monitoring





Weed Management

Crews are spraying for weeds as required under our exploration permit, based on last year's plant survey requested by the BC Government.

A follow-up weed survey will take place a few weeks after spraying to check results and help plan next year's program.

Improving the Project Area

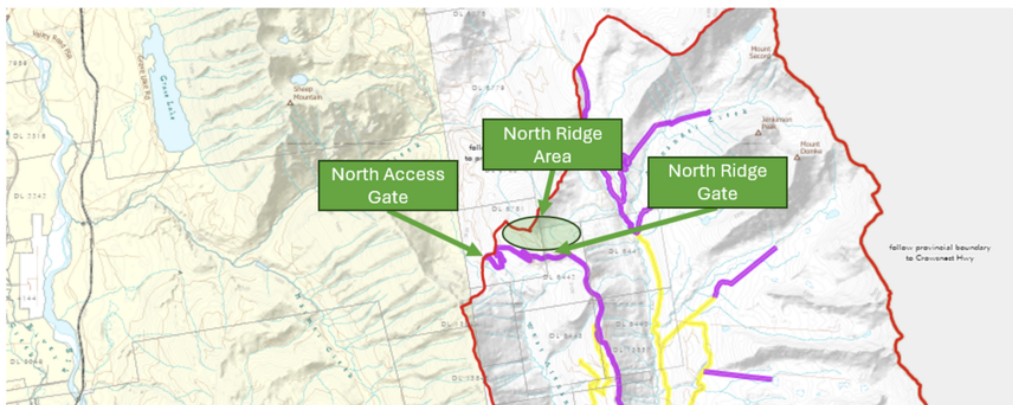


Picnic Tables

New picnic tables have been installed at the top of Crown Mountain, providing a convenient place for hikers and other visitors to take a break during their visit.

Gates

Crown Mountain Resources has installed and donated two gates to BC Water, Land and Resource Stewardship (WLRs). The gates support WLRs efforts to reduce illegal motorized vehicle use of roads in the Project area.





North Access Gate

- Located at the north end of the Motor Vehicle Closure Area, on the trail used to travel over the top of Crown Mountain.
- This section of trail is closed to motorized use during hunting season, September 1 through November 30.
- The gate will be open December 1 through August 31.

North Ridge Gate

- Located off the side of the main trail over Crown Mountain, where a network of trails leads north.
- These trails are closed to motorized use year-round, with the exception of snowmobiles.
- This gate will be locked year-round.
